Literacy is Crucial to Success in Life

Literacy is defined by the American Heritage Dictionary as "The condition or quality of being literate, especially the ability to read and write." or "The condition or quality of being knowledgeable in a particular subject or field." According to California Literacy (www.caliteracy.org), 2 million native English speakers in California are "functionally illiterate," the US is 49th among "the 156 United Nation member countries in its rate of literacy," "46% of American adults cannot understand the label on their prescription medicine," "33% of children in California will not finish high school," and "24% or adults in California are at the lowest literacy level." We have an obvious problem with literacy in California, and we must try to fix that problem.

Literacy is crucial to success in life. We need it to be able to communicate; we need it to be able to get a job. We need it to support ourselves; we need it to make our community better.

Many students in the US can't read. They have tried to learn, but their teachers ignore these "invisible" students. Teachers are very important to a student's life, especially when the student is young. When a teacher ignores his or her students and doesn't help them learn how to read, the students will be negatively impacted. They will probably also blame later problems in life on their ignorant teacher.

Invisible students feel left out because no one will help them. If teachers take special notice of students that have been long ignored, the students will be forever grateful. Teaching them to read will boost their self confidence, and they will be more likely to lead a successful life.

Students look up to their teachers. They see them as a source of knowledge; someone to aspire to. A teacher's job is to teach, and when they don't properly teach a student and ignore him or her, the student's beliefs will be undermined.
