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PROJECT INTRODUCTION

For as long as I have been using digital platforms to create art, there have been many digital art skills I have wanted to learn to make my illustrations more realistic and advanced.

This included: drawing realistic textures such as fur, drawing fire, oil pastel art, or drawing water.

To start, I set out to draw a waterfall.

This process was less about getting the shadows and details perfect, which I was struggling with, and more about using opacity, stroke, and combining different brushes effectively to create a misty effect.

- I used a variety of different brushes and tutorials to improve on drawing a realistic waterfall.
- I used white brushes with different textures and strokes to create the waterfall, and I used big, transparent brushes to create the misty effect.

In the end, this was my favorite waterfall. Here is the final product and a time lapse video of my



WATERCOLOR


I created this colorful watercolor cactus using brushes that varied in opacity based on pressure (water-like). I added texture as well as different tints, tones, and shades of pink and green.

CHALLENGES + OVERCOMING

- original plan of drawing water droplets did not work out
- achieving desired colors using the pressure sensitive brushes
- figuring out the combination strokes & brushes for the waterfall
- adjusting the brushes effectively (size, opacity)
