1. I have always loved art even from a young age, but mostly sketching, so I wanted to step outside my comfort zone.










Materials I used

Watercolor Markers






Watercolor Pastels






Watercolor paper, very important you use the right kind of paper

A Quick little How To. Markers.

- 1. With Marker Sketch an initial outline of what you want to draw
- 2. Wet your brush, dry slightly on paper towel and paint in between the lines
- 3. When you are ready to re wet your brush use one cup to re wet and one to clean, this is so you don't mix the colors and get an icky result.
- 4. Tips: When blending, Warm colors with warm colors, and Cool colors with Cool colors.




A Quick little How To. Pastels.

- 1. With pastels sketch an initial outline of what you want to draw
- 2. Wet your brush, dry slightly on paper towel and paint in between the lines
- 3. When you are ready to re wet your brush use one cup to re wet and one to clean, this is so you don't mix the colors and get an icky result.
- 4. Tips: If you would like to blend colors have a separate sheet of paper available. So you can draw the colors and blend them together with water

- The initial outline of my drawings when using markers were hard to blend, there would still be a really prominent line. Too much Pigment.
