The two comedians I chose are Jeff Dunham and Gabriel 'Fluffy' Iglesias. I have been watching Gabriel Iglesias comedy specials for a few years now and have always found him funny. Just recently I have started watching small clips of Jeff Dunhams shows on youtube. Both comedians have their own style of how their comedy is portrayed.

Gabriel 'Fluffy' Iglesias is mainly known as a comedian and has had a few netflix specials. He also stars in a Netflix TV show called Mr. Iglesias. He gets the nickname Fluffy because of one of his well known jokes. The six levels of fatness. "The original five levels are Big, Healthy, Husky, Fluffy, and Damn! People ask, "What could be bigger than damn!" The new level's called "Oh, hell no!" To this scale Gabriel Iglesias would be placed at number four, Fluffy. Iglesias' type of humor is Anecdote(a brief, interesting/amusing story that helps the humorist make a point or reveal a truth that is more general than the story itself) because he always gets to the point in a humorous way when telling his jokes. When telling the jokes he is not only able to get to the point without too many details but he uses different voices and sound effects to add to them. Iglesias uses his whole body by walking across the stage, using his arms, and moving in ways that add to the story. A lot of his comedy is Situational Humor because he tells stories from his personal life. These stories would either be after shows, times when he is out in public, or when he is on the road. You can also watch clips on youtube of bits and pieces from his shows. His jokes are easy to understand and easy to follow. If you watch a random video of Iglesias comedy show you wouldn't need to have previous knowledge of what was happening.

Jeff Dunham is a well known American ventriloquist. For his performances, he brings out his puppets and not only interacts with them but makes them interact with each other. Dunham uses a banter(good-natured teasing back and forth) type of humor by causing his characters to say witty remarks towards each other. He will often have one to two characters out with him. His characters all have their own personalities, way of speaking, and unique look. To me it seems like each character has their own backstory and way of thinking. Dunham's changes not only the pitch of his voice but what it sounds like, so he is able to add to his puppet and makes it even more funny. His believability that the character is its own person is very skilled as well. Dunham moves the puppet to what is being said and what is happening around them. The mouth of the character also moves in a timely manner that matches with the words the character is saying.

Both comedians have different styles for their jokes and how they are portrayed. They use different forms of humor and different tools or props in order to help their jokes come across. Gabriel Iglesias focuses more on real life experiences he has had and Jeff Dunhum seems to focus more on fictional stories. Even though both comedians use different forms of humor, I find both funny.
